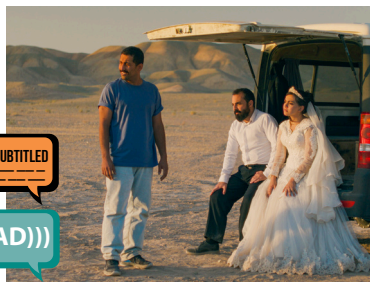
## IT WAS JUST AN ACCIDENT (12A)
